


Garden of Eden

Parents: God told Adam to name the animals that were created, and Adam named them. Adam realized that all the animals were created male and female, but he was alone. Adam was lonely.




Parents: Have your child connect the dots on the two pictures, then write down the name of each animal under the picture. Color each animal. Ask: Are there males and females of these animals?




Parents: Adam and his wife live happily in the garden. God is with them and instructs them to take care of the Garden of Eden.




The Tree of Life


Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil

Parents: God instructed Adam and Eve not to touch or eat the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil because, if they did, they would surely die.




Satan tempts Eve.
