





Fall is a time when farmers harvest fruits and vegetables from their gardens.



They bring all of them in from the fields to the house or barn. They are stored to feed their families and other people all year long.




The Bible tells us to save one-tenth of our incomes so we can go to the Feast of Tabernacles. In ancient times, people harvested their crops and exchanged them for money.




The Feast is explained in the Bible as a time when God's government will stop all war and conflicts in the world.




We obey God and pack our best clothes to take with us.




Sometimes going to the Feast means we must travel a long way over mountain roads that twist and turn. Help this family find their way to the Feast of Tabernacles.




When we arrive, we dress in our best clothes to attend the opening night services. What should Dad put on next? A neck ___ ___.




Color several ties he can wear at the Feast.



Mom puts on her best clean clothes because she is going before God.




She puts on her favorite items. Color some pieces of jewelry she could wear.




The first day is a Holy Day. We will see many families coming to services on this day. All hear God's Word from ministers and bring an offering.




We meet new people from all over the world.

Write the year and names of some new friends you meet during the Feast on these squares to help you remember them all year.




During the Feast, we often eat in restaurants. We should use our best manners and be good examples to all who see us.
